



Cobras off to a great start to 2018

The Cobras have continued their success from 2017 into the start of 2018, and are gearing up for the final stretch before tournament time. Headed into the month of February, the Cobras are 15-5 and have only one conference loss.

In the first contest after returning from the winter break the Cobras earned a hard fought 96-91 win over Sandhills Community College. The offense was led by guard Chase Byrd who scored 32 points in his season debut. Byrd was one of four Caldwell players to score in double digits.

In a rematch with Combine Academy, the Cobras earned a 108-82 victory led by Byrd's 28 points. Byrd was joined in scoring in double figures by fellow guards Jaylon Wray, Trevor Willis and Omari Koffa who scored 21, 20, and 12 points respectively.

In a Jan. 13 showdown, the Caldwell Cobras bested the Brunswick Dolphins 95-83 to earn a 1-0 mark in Region X conference play. This game also marked the third straight game that the Cobras score, 95 or more points, their longest stretch of the season with at least 95 points.

The Cobras then defeated conference foe Denmark Tech 79-74, led by Wray's 22 points, 8 rebounds, 5 assists and 2 steals. Wray led fellow guards Byrd, who had 18 points, and Willis, who scored 14 points, in double digit scoring for the Cobras.

The Cobras' conference winning streak continued with an 85-71 win over USC-Salkehatchie, led by Willis' 19 points and Byrd's 14-point, 11-rebound performance.

The conference winning streak came to an end with a 73-69 road loss at Spartanburg Methodist.
