

ADMISSION

Course work includes instruction in all phases of professional imaging, hair design, chemical processes, skin care, nail care, multi-cultural practices, business/computer principles, product knowledge, and other selected topics.

Program Outcomes

The Cosmetology curriculum is designed to provide competency-based knowledge, scientific/artistic principles, and hands-on fundamentals associated with the cosmetology industry. The curriculum provides a simulated salon environment which enables students to develop manipulative skills.

Occupational Outlook

Graduates should qualify to sit for the State Board of Cosmetic Art examination. Upon successfully passing the State Board exam, graduates will be issued a license. Employment is available in beauty salons and related businesses.

In addition, 1500 clock hours and practical skills, required by the State Board of Cosmetic Arts, must be completed.</p> <p>Upon passing the State Board licensing exam, a graduate is a fully-licensed cosmetologist.</p>	<p>The 34-credit hour certificate program includes all required cosmetology classes.</p> <p>In addition, 1200 clock hours and practical skills, required by the State Board of Cosmetic Arts, must be completed.</p> <p>Upon passing the State Board licensing exam, students completing the certificate program are licensed as apprentices and must complete an additional 1040 clock-hours, working under the direct supervision of a licensed cosmetologist.</p>

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Dress Code

Students must wear the following:

- Black scrubs
- Black closed-toe shoes
- Black smock (purchased from Sally's Beauty Supply – must be the vest style smock)

Scrubs and shoes may be bought anywhere, but must be completely black (no decorative trim, stitching, etc).

First Day of Class

On the first day of class, please come dressed in dress code. Bring your kit and book bundle. Also, bring your **Driver's License/ID** and **Social Security Card**. Copies will be made of these documents and will be kept in a locked, secure location. These items are required for State Board inspections, which can happen as early as the first day of class. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Attendance

Due to required clock-hours and performances, attendance is very important. If you are late or leave class early, that will count as a tardy. Three tardies = 1 absence.

- **Diploma Students**

- **Certificate Students**
